The GCI Professional Development Seminar provides secondary school educators with a unique opportunity: to learn how to create an ethics-based leadership curriculum while engaging with students from around the globe who are participating in the Global Citizens Youth Summit, GCI's flagship event and the launchpad for the 10-month GCI Fellowship.

Educators will be introduced to key elements of the GCI Method, a curriculum based in ethical leadership and grounded in the methodologies of Discussion-Based Learning, Design Thinking and Human Connectivity. The Seminar will be led by GCI Faculty and Speakers, represented by seasoned professors from Phillips Exeter Academy, Harvard Business School and Stanford University.

At the Seminar, educators will

- Observe a Harkness® educational session (Discussion-Based Learning class) in action
- Participate directly in a Design Thinking workshop and a leadership case study
- Shadow students as they develop their "Glocal Service Projects" (GSPs)
- Join a collaborative session on ethics
- Network at the Leadership Evening event
- Attend the GCI Forum, a half-day public event (in English) for the Japanese community
 - Address how best to empower youth and embrace diversity to transform our world
