

Henry Rosovsky United States Harvard University Geyser University Professor Emeritus

Dr. Henry Rosovsky is an economic historian specializing in East Asia. He has distinguished himself as an educator in institutions of higher learning, including the University of California at Berkeley. Since 1965, he has been a staple of the Harvard University community. He served as Professor of Economics until 1996, Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences from 1973 to 1991, Acting President of Harvard from 1984 to 1987 and the first Harvard faculty in a 100 years to be selected as a member of the Harvard Corporation.

Throughout his career, he has published numerous articles and books, including Capital Formation in Japan and Quantitative Japanese Economic History in 1961, Japanese Economic Growth with Kazushi Ohkawa in 1973, and The University: An Owner's Manual in 1990. He received the Ency clopedia Britannica Achievement in Life Award for Achievement in Education in 1981 and the Clark Kerr Medal for service to Higher Education from the University of California at Berkeley in 1992. In 1984 the country of France named him Chevalier of the Legion of Honor, and in 1988, Japan awarded him the Star of the Order of the Sacred Treasure.
